

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Criminal Justice System - Victim Support Does your plan include how to support a large volume of victims and families as the case moves through the criminal justice system?

- An overview of the role of the victim advocate (e.g. 24-hour crisis response, companioning, criminal justice victim support)
- · Training on the use of prosecutorial advocacy
- · Understanding the long-term impact of trauma
- Training on skill-based intervention
- Practical issues for multiple victims involved in protracted criminal justice processes
- · Understanding the use of post-trauma resources

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Behavioral Health Response Does your plan include identifications of behavioral health services that have capacity to respond to individuals and the community for short and long-term response?

Early Planning

- Do service providers have training in Disaster and/or Mass Violence Response?
- Are trained providers included in the community response plan?
- · Identification of local behavioral health services & responders
- Plan for pre-crisis training of local behavioral health responders (NOVA 3-hour "down & dirty" or 3-day NOVA Basic Crisis Response Training)™

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Review of NOVA "Companioning" services and training of behavioral health responders

Behavioral Health Response

cont.

Activation/Deployment/Response

- Review of standby/activation/deployment of local crisis response team(s)
 process including use of state or national support resources, if necessary
- Use of behavioral health staff/volunteers to respond to mass violence under the direction of local law enforcement, FBI, EMA, Governor's Office, victim assistance, Red Cross, etc. (Companioning survivors through available services, Group Crisis Intervention, etc.)
- Staffing of table at FAC/Resiliency Center with local behavioral health resources, materials, one-on-one services, follow up, etc.
